# **New waste collections**

You are in phase 1 for the new waste service - your new collections start in June 2025.

### Delivery of wheelie bins and caddies

We've been delivering wheelie bins and food waste recycling caddies to households in phase 1. Bins and caddies may not arrive at the same time. If they have not arrived by 1 June 2025, please let us know (see back page for contact details).

### Your new collections

New waste collections start from the week of Monday 9 June 2025. To find out your exact start date, and what day of the week your collection day will be for the new service, see the letter sent with this leaflet. From June, see <a href="mailto:newforest.gov.uk/FindYourCollection">newforest.gov.uk/FindYourCollection</a> to view your upcoming collections.

### From your start date:

- your rubbish and recycling will be collected on alternate weeks, from your new wheelie bins. This means, we will collect your rubbish one week, and recycling the next week.
- your food waste will be collected weekly, from your outdoor food waste recycling caddy. It will be collected on the same day as your recycling or rubbish bin (exceptions apply, see page 11).
- your glass recycling will still be collected every 4 weeks, from the black collection box. See <a href="mailto:newforest.gov.uk/FindYourCollection">newforest.gov.uk/FindYourCollection</a>.
- we will no longer collect sacks from your property.

### Your new bins and caddies

### **Recycling bin**

240 litre, green-lid wheelie bin, for your household recycling.

#### Rubbish bin

180 litre, black-lid wheelie bin, for general household waste.



# Indoor food waste caddy

5 litre, grey indoor food waste caddy.

# Outdoor food waste caddy

23 litre, brown outdoor food waste caddy.

### **Glass collection box**

45 litre, black glass recycling box.

Do not put the bins and caddies out for collection until your start date; they will not be collected. Please continue using sacks until the new service starts.

## **Using your food waste caddies**

Check what you can put in your caddy (see page 6) and then:

1 Line your indoor caddy.

We recommend lining your indoor caddy. Once the starter roll of liners (delivered inside your caddy) has run out, you can buy liners, or use newspaper or small bags, for example bread bags.

2 Empty the indoor caddy into your outdoor caddy.

When your indoor caddy is full or it's your weekly collection, empty it into your outdoor caddy. If you are using a liner or bag, tie it at the top.

**3** Lock your outdoor caddy.

Put the handle into the upright position to lock the lid in place - this helps to keep it secure from animals, and helps our crews collect your caddy.



4 Put your outdoor caddy out for collection.

Put your outdoor caddy at your property boundary, before 6am on your collection day.

Your food waste will be recycled, but for tips on preventing food waste, see lovefoodhatewaste.com.

After your food waste is collected each week, it will go to an anaerobic digestion facility. This is an alternative way of composting food waste to produce renewable energy and fertiliser.

## What to do on bin collection day

Each week, check if it is your household rubbish or recycling being collected. There are tips to remember your bin day on page 9.

Your wheelie bin and outdoor food waste caddy:

- must be out by 6am on your collection day, and ideally not before
  6pm the night before
- should be placed at your property boundary, or agreed collection point if you have one, and not obstructing public highways

Please bring your bin and caddy back to where you store it as soon as possible after your waste has been collected.

If your bin or caddy is overflowing, contains incorrect items, or the lid isn't fully closed, we won't collect it. We'll leave a notice explaining why and how to fix it for your next collection.

Extra waste, left next to or on top of your bin, will not be collected. However, we will collect a small bundle of flattened cardboard if it won't fit inside your recycling bin.



# **Food waste recycling**



What you can put in your food waste caddies:



These can be raw or cooked, plate scrapings, uneaten food, out of date, or mouldy food.

### What you cannot put in your food waste caddy:

- anything that is not food
- packaging (except for what you are using as a liner)
- garden waste and flowers
- liquids, liquid fats, and oils

# **Household recycling**



What you can put in your recycling bin:



Please check items are empty, clean and dry – this helps make sure they'll be accepted at the recycling facility.

Items must go into your recycling bin loose – no sacks, bags, or liners.

When the new service starts, you will be able to recycle the same 6 things in the recycling bin as you would have put in your clear recycling sack. We are working to offer recycling for more items. This is dependent on new processing facilities that will be provided by Hampshire County Council.

# **Glass recycling**



The black collection box is for your glass recycling. Please check items are empty, clean and dry.

### What you can put in your glass recycling:

• glass bottles (metal caps on) | • glass jars (lids on)

### What you cannot put in your glass recycling:

- drinking glasses
- light bulbs
- glass kitchenware
- windowpane glass

### Household rubbish

General household waste that can't be recycled can be put in your rubbish bin.

This includes foil, polystyrene, nappies, gift wrap, and plastic pots, tubs, and trays.

Small amounts of broken or sharp items can go in the bin if they are securely and safely wrapped.

We recommend putting general waste into sacks, which you can buy from shops or online. We no longer provide sacks for your household.

### What you cannot put in your rubbish bin:

- batteries, vapes, and electrical items (they can cause fires)
- business or trade waste
- bulky household items

- DIY or house clearance waste
- large sharp items (these should be taken to a household waste and recycling centre)

## Tips to remember your bin day

Here are some ways to help you remember what waste is being collected on what days:

- from June, you can check on our website by entering your postcode at newforest.gov.uk/FindYourCollection
- write your bin collection day on the calendar that came with this leaflet. It will also be available to download at newforest.gov.uk/FindYourCollection.
- set reminders on your phone's calendar or to do list
- write down your schedule and put it on your fridge or kitchen cupboard door

Recyclenow.com also give this tip for remembering what bin day it is: If all else fails, there's still the tried and tested method of looking out to see what the neighbours are doing!

## Support and help

#### Different capacity or extra bins

We understand it may take a few weeks to get used to a new waste service. If, after this time, you believe you need more waste collected, please check details on our website. Eligibility for collecting extra general waste (rubbish), includes people with medical needs, households with 6 or more occupants, or 2 or more children in nappies. We can also supply smaller capacity wheelie bins. See newforest.gov.uk/AdditionalContainer for details.

#### **Assisted collections**

If you are unable to put your household waste out for collection due to a disability, illness, or injury, you may be eligible for assisted collections. See <a href="newforest.gov.uk/AssistedCollections">newforest.gov.uk/AssistedCollections</a> for information.

If you are already receiving an assisted collection, you do not need to reapply unless we contact you to say your renewal is due.

### Lost, stolen, or damaged bin or caddy

Wheelie bins and food waste recycling caddies are provided to the household for the purposes of collecting your waste, but remain the property of New Forest District Council.
