

Electoral Review of New Forest District Council

Warding Patterns – Zone 5 – Totton & North East

Task and Finish Group have agreed:-

- Group the District into "Zones".
- Town and Parishes building blocks.
- Meet with each Zone and invite Ward Councillors to feed in their local knowledge.
- Work within each Zone to balance the criteria and create warding pattern options.
- Bring recommended options back to the Task and Finish Group, Cabinet and Council.
- Submit full proposals to the LGBCE.



Warding Patterns - Criteria

- Electoral Equality for voters.
- Community Identities and Interests.
- Effective and convenient Local Government.
- These are all of equal balance and importance.



Electoral Equality

Figure one: electoral variances

Local authority A has an electorate of 100,000 in 2012. In 2018 (five years after the planned completion of the review), the electorate of Local authority A is expected to be 103,000.

The Commission has decided that it is minded to recommend a council size of 40 councillors for Local authority A.

In these circumstances, the Commission will base its new ward patterns on each councillor representing around 2,500 electors.




Effective and Convenient Local Government

 - -1, 2 or 3 Member Wards
- 'Doughnut' Wards are not considered effective by the LGBCE.

Our polling station is too far away, changing the ward would fix this


It should go back to how it was 20 years ago, it worked better

If it ain't broke, don't fix it


The Residents' Association represents these ten roads, and hold regular meetings at X Community Centre Oakhill should be with Maryland because they share access to the park and the doctor's surgery





 - Marchwood ward (parish) Total Electorate 4,745
 - Totton North Total Electorate 4,984
 - Totton East Total Electorate 5,159
 - Totton Central Total Electorate 4,405
 - Totton South Total Electorate 4,809
 - Totton West Total Electorate 3,932



Areas 2 & 3 – Totton & Eling & Marchwood

- Key Questions
 - Can Marchwood, Eling and some of Hounsdown (Totton South ward) form a new 2 Member Ward?
 - Having put some of Totton South and Marchwood together, can the remaining area of Totton South become a new 1 Member Ward?
 - The current Totton East Ward needs approximately 1,000 electors to work as a 2 Member Ward. Can these come from Totton Central?
 - The current Totton North Ward needs approximately 1,200 electors to work as a 2 Member Ward. Can these come from Totton West?
 - Can the remaining areas in Totton West and Totton Central come together to form a new 2 Member Ward?
